**New Alabama Office and Regional Manager Look to Grow
SunOne Solutions' Forestry Carbon Offset Business**

(Auburn-Opelika, AL – September 21, 2009) One of the nation's leading carbon credit companies, SunOne Solutions (www.sunonesolutions.com), announced today the formal launch of its Alabama office to focus on sustainable forestland in the Southeastern U.S. The strategic location in Auburn-Opelika, AL is headed by John McDaniel, a 20 year veteran of the forestry industry, and gives SunOne Solutions a local presence for developing carbon offset generating projects in the region and the ability to leverage forestry expertise globally.

"We're very excited about this opportunity to work with local landowners to show them another income opportunity as a result of their conservation practices," said SunOne Solutions' Regional Manager John McDaniel.

McDaniel and his team will work with landowners in Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, Tennessee, and other southeastern states to develop carbon sequestration projects on forestland and no-till farmland. Landowners who sequester carbon through sustainable land management practices can qualify for carbon "offset" credits, and may benefit financially by selling them on the Chicago Climate Exchange, the California Climate Action Registry, the Voluntary Carbon Standard, or other carbon markets.

"We assist landowners in identifying the incentives that are available for their particular operation, then help them cut through the red tape and start making money," McDaniels also said.

John Hodges, SunOne Solutions' President, added that *"SunOne Solutions is different from other carbon offset companies in that our partnering approach does not require landowners to cover project development costs or take financial risks. Instead, SunOne Solutions covers these upfront costs and allows landowners the opportunity to hold their carbon offset credits and sell them whenever they like market prices."*

Under current systems, landowners and managers could make up to \$15 per acre for sustainable managed forestland. In addition, the Obama administration is pushing for a mandatory, federal "cap-and-trade" system where polluting companies would be required to purchase carbon credits which could raise prices even further. The U.S. House of Representatives recently passed a law supporting carbon offsets with the Senate taking up the measure this Fall.
